

Appendix to the Regulations of Parc des Princes

HEALTH REGULATIONS

1. Presentation

The purpose of these Health Regulations is to prevent the spread of the COVID-19 virus within the Stadium, and to preserve the health and safety of the general public and staff working in the Stadium.

It enters into force upon its publication and shall be automatically extended until the end of the pandemic as declared by the competent authorities.

The Operator reserves the right to fully or partially modify these Health Regulations at any time for legitimate reason, particularly to take into account any development of the health situation in Ile-de-France and instructions from the government.

The Health Regulations apply to all persons, whether a member of the public (holder of a Ticket) or staff working on the site (accredited personnel).

It is displayed on all entrances to the Stadium, is addressed to the public by email prior to any Event and is available online at the website: www.psg.fr or by request by email to the Health Advisor.

2. Preventive measures

Abiding by current preventive measures is mandatory inside the Stadium.

The preventive measures are recalled hereafter, in these Health Regulations and are displayed at entrances to the Stadium and enclosed areas in the Stadium.

The main preventive measures are as follows:

- Wash your hands often. Use soap and water, or hand sanitizer.
- Keep a distance from anyone who is coughing or sneezing.
- Do not touch your eyes, nose or mouth. If you cough or sneeze, cover your mouth and nose with your elbow or a tissue.
- Use a clean tissue and dispose of it each time.
- Stay at home if you do not feel well.
- Consult a doctor if you have a fever, cough or difficulty breathing.

Anyone not respecting these preventive measures may be refused access to the Stadium by the Organiser or Operator.

2.1. Wearing of masks by staff

At Events, all staff working on the site are required to wear a protective mask as well as any other protective materials that are necessary according to their work. Masks should be worn upon arrival of staff working in the Stadium, throughout the duration of their work. In the event of a task requiring more than four (4) hours' presence at the Stadium, staff must have a spare mask. Failure to wear a mask will not be tolerated except where the worker is in an isolated place, with no direct contact with anyone else or behind a plexiglass protective material.

Masks are provided by the employer of staff hired.

2.2. Wearing of masks by members of the public

Members of the public are required to wear a protective mask upon entry to the stadium, including in queues.

Not wearing a mask is permitted for eating.

2.3. Social distancing

Wearing a mask does not exempt you from social distancing obligations relative to the health crisis. Social distancing requires one metre's distance to be observed between each person or group of up to ten (10) people living together.

Hugging and kissing is also prohibited within the Stadium.



3 Staff access to the Stadium

Firstly, it is recalled that all employees and service providers must report any symptom identified by the authorities as related to the COVID-19 pandemic to their employer. Anyone presenting symptoms must not enter the Stadium.

3.1 Access controls

Staff must use their access to limit waiting time. Different groups of people must not pass by each other at entrances and there must be direct access to working areas. Staff are subject to the control measures implemented by the Operator and will provide to it all information for an attendance record to be kept. To limit waiting times, two (2) people will be present at each access point to carry out those control measures.

Each person accessing the Stadium through a given entrance must exit through the same entrance. The accreditation scan is mandatory upon arriving and leaving the Stadium. Arrival and departure times are recorded by the Operator in the IT attendance record.

3.2 Detection questionnaire

Staff must complete and sign a COVID-19 symptom detection questionnaire. This questionnaire will be provided to them on the day of the Event. It must be completed and returned to the Operator, ideally prior to their arrival to the Stadium and at the latest upon presenting themselves at the access door for the first time. In the event of a positive response to one or more of the questions listed, the decision regarding authorisation to access the Stadium is at the discretion of the Health Advisor after medical advice.

Anyone who is refused access to the Stadium must inform their main point of contact or supervisor within the Operator or Organiser.

3.3 Hand sanitising gel / Disinfecting

Staff must use the hand sanitising gel provided by the Operator upon access to the Stadium and at the entrances to all accessible enclosed spaces.

It is also mandatory for staff to disinfect their hands after each use of shared equipment. It is recalled for all intents and purposes that disinfectants should be applied to dry hands and not rinsed with water.

Staff must also regularly aerate enclosed spaces in which they work.

3.4 Moving around the Stadium

When moving around the Stadium, staff must follow the directions of foot traffic. They must leave doors open as much as possible and avoid touching door handles and other contact zones.

3.5 Breaks / meals

Staff catering should be strictly limited to the distribution of meal baskets or meal and beverage trays. Shared products are prohibited, only individual drinks bottles are permitted. Staff must adhere to staggered break and meal times to avoid large groups.

4. Public access to the Stadium

The Stadium is accessed via queues allowing sufficient social distancing, in which it is mandatory to wear face masks. Hand sanitising gel is provided at all points of access to the Stadium, and at turnstiles.

All measures for controlling access and checking trade IDs are implemented by the Organiser in respect of protective measures.

All instructions relative to foot traffic in the Stadium and access to stands in order to ensure public health and safety must be strictly respected by everyone moving through the Stadium. This may in particular take the form of markings on the ground and/or extra barriers.

5. Hygiene and protection materials

Hand sanitising gel is provided throughout the Stadium and in particular at all these access points, in addition to soap (virucide) and water points which remain available in all sanitary facilities.

6. Respect for capacity of spaces

The maximum number of people permitted in certain spaces is displayed at their entrance and must be strictly respected.

Displays will be updated regularly as the situation evolves.

7. Disinfection during the Event and cleaning of spaces

Throughout the Event, the Stadium's cleaning teams will disinfect all elements regularly touched by the public (handrails of stairways and escalators, intercoms, bar, etc.).

8. Catering

The conditions for access and consumption at catering points in the Stadium are susceptible to change in order to comply with the health and safety measures applicable in Ile-de-France. In particular, it is specified that one person per group will be allowed to make orders.

9. Facilities and equipment in the Stadium

Activities not permitting the current preventive measures in force in the Stadium for players, public and staff will not be running (foosball tables, make-up workshops, etc.). The stadium lockers are also closed to the public.

Some services will however remain accessible, such as phone charging.

In addition, given the restriction of access to public transport and the public authorities' cycling incentives, several secure bicycle parking spaces may be provided around the Stadium.

10. Control and management in case of symptoms

Any person declaring or presenting with symptoms: fever and/or cough, difficulty breathing, speaking or swallowing, loss of sense of taste and/or smell, will be brought to the infirmary specifically arranged in Tribune Paris (Access 101) for isolation. A medical examination can then be carried out to determine if they can remain in the Stadium. In the event of serious signs, the Emergency Services will be notified by the Health Advisor for intervention. All areas in which any contaminated person or person presenting symptoms of contamination may have passed through will be systematically specifically cleaned and disinfected.

11. Evacuation of the Stadium after the Event

The Organiser reserves the right to enforce a gradual exit from the Stadium upon the public at the end of the Event. The Stadium's management staff along with security staff will evacuate the Stadium by rows of the stands in order to prevent hustling and crowds. All doors of the Stadium (passageways, vomitories, and external gates) will be open to facilitate exit.

12. Sanctions

Failure to comply with any provision of these Health Regulations, in particular compliance with preventive measures, may result in the Organiser applying one or more of the following sanctions: refused access to the Stadium or particular areas in the Stadium, exclusion from the Stadium or particular areas in the Stadium, presentation of the offender to the police, termination or suspension of their membership (for Paris Saint-Germain matches) without reimbursement and/or any other sanction decided by the Organiser.

13. STopCovid app

It is highly recommended that people coming to the Stadium download the STopCovid app, the purpose of which is to alert people who have been close to someone who has tested positive, so that they can seek treatment as soon as possible.

14. Health Advisor

A Health Advisor has been appointed, whose role consists of ensuring the proper implementation of all of the provisions of these Health Regulations and being the main point of contact for the authorities and decision-making bodies on this matter. It is recalled that all spectators are required to adopt responsible behaviour for themselves and others and that all of the measures implemented by the Operator do not exonerate spectators from their own responsibility.
